Kent and Andres introduced the Georgia Shoreline Stormwater Project. FNLC awarded this study to Watershed Consulting Associates LLC. A drive-by map was sketched out identifying outflows to St. Albans Bay. They are seeking information on the privately held developments on the lakeshore. (Pines and Cedars) Risk zones will be assessed a 1, 2, or 3, 1 being the most severe. 3 projects will be selected for funding. The study will be completed in July of 2021.

Silver Lake Woods:

CL4 portion of Silver Lake Rd.: Suz has contacted 8 firms for estimates, 3 have responded and 1 has visited the site. Ken is of the opinion a ford is

not desirable in this location. Fords are installed in straight sections of streams this stream has an upstream 90degree bend, close to the crossing. Peter supported a skidder bridge as a crossing structure. Ken has estimates for these 4' wide temporary bridges.

Wayside sign: Installed by Chris et al, looks great

Trail marking: Suz has started to paint mark the connector trail.

Trail Mowing: Dan is taking care of the main trail – the side trail needs mowing.

Signage: 1 Small sign has been installed at the property entrance. 2 more need to be erected.

Trail Names: The following names were discussed: Henderson trail, Kipling trail, Wilcox trail 1 more name is required. (Not discussed at the meeting, I checked old emails from John Moseley – he would like the Kipling trail to be in a more remote location, the new connector?-Ken's note)

Invasives Grant: We have been awarded a \$5000 grant to get invasives in check. Cutting and chemical controls will be required. An educational component/will be required. An RFP is being developed.

RGNA: Cristin will walk the trail and check for general condition and deadfall.

Henley Webster Forest: Chris will walk the trails to access condition.
